General Comments

EU Kids Online is a project of the European Commission and the Council of Europe. It is a joint effort to address the challenges of children's internet use.

The Guide is intended to provide a framework for the development of national laws and policies. It is based on the principles of the European Convention on Human Rights and the Council of Europe's Recommendation on the Protection of Children from Inappropriate Content on the Internet.

It offers a set of principles and recommendations that are based on international law and human rights.
