FAQ 25: Is it better to research children at home, at school, or elsewhere?

What's the issue?

Children can be more relaxed at home, and interviewing children at home permits direct observation of their interaction with siblings and parents, as well as evidence of the arrangement of media goods around the home, but it may restrict the child's freedom to report on parental rules or values regarding media, and they may feel much freer to discuss this at school.
